CLOSED MUSEUMS AND CANCELED CONCERTS AGRICULTURE FAIR CLOSED EARLIER THAN PROVIDED

The management of the Louvre announces that the Paris museum - the most visited in the world - will remain closed this Sunday due to a right of withdrawal voted by the staff, worried about the spread of the coronavirus epidemic. She also added that an exceptional CHSCT (Health, Safety and Working Conditions Committee) will be held on Monday, without specifying whether the museum will reopen or not. "Subject to possible future developments in government measures relating to places open to the public, no concert will be canceled in the next 15 days", announces the Zénith de Paris on its website, while other rooms in France decided to postpone them and that the authorities decided to cancel the events gathering more than 5000 people in "confined" spaces.

The Zénith de Paris can in principle accommodate more than 6000 people. "We will do our best to keep you informed as soon as we have more information," said the concert hall, however. The concert of Maître Gims scheduled for Nantes on Saturday March 7 is canceled due to restrictions imposed by the authorities, announces the director of the Zénith de Nantes on the Facebook page of this room. The Zénith de Paris, which plans several events next week, said it would specify possible cancellations in this room on Monday. The AccorHotels Arena (Paris Bercy) has closed the competition "Juste Debout", scheduled for this Sunday. The National Union of

Musical and Variety Entertainment called Saturday a "crisis meeting" with the government to discuss the consequences of these cancellations which could be numerous. LCI Source
